3. Study figure. 2, map of St. Lawrence Sea way and answer the questions that follow:

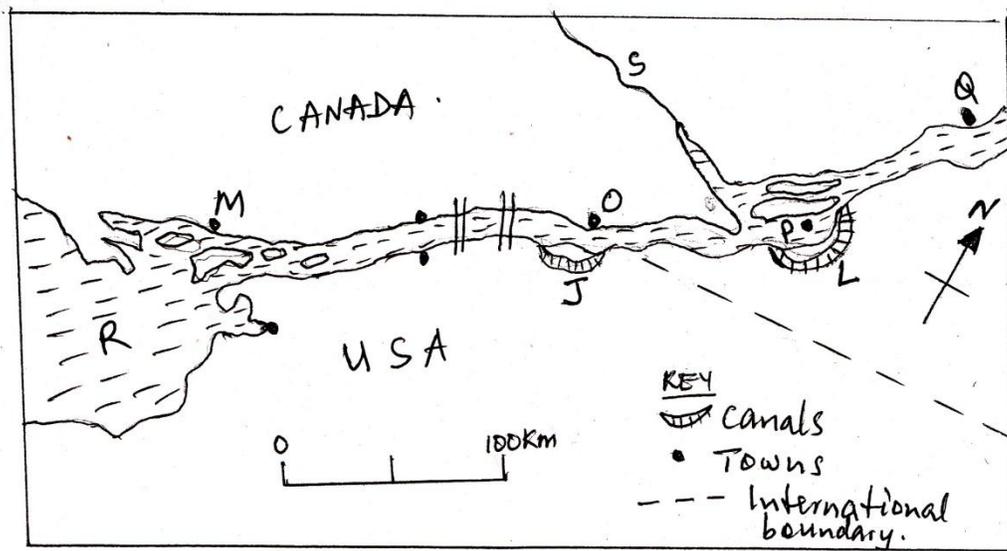

5. Study Fig.2: **Map of the Tennessee Valley** provided below and answer the questions that follow:

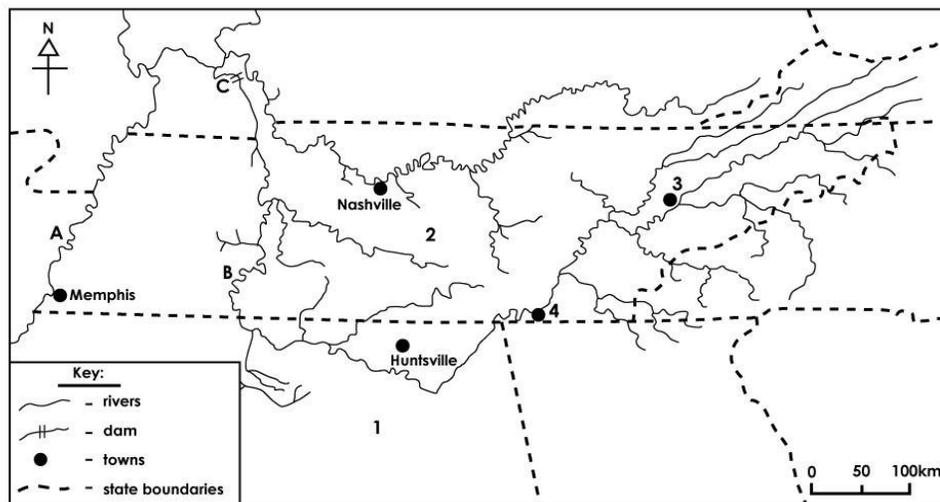
