5. Explain the contribution of the mining industry to the development of **either** *Germany* or *Republic of South Africa*. (25 marks)
6. (a) Account for the development of **either** *Rotterdam* or *Mombasa* into a port. (15 marks)
(b) What are the problems faced by the people using the port chosen in (a) above? (10 marks)
7. (a) To what extent have physical factors contributed to the development of tourism in **either** *Switzerland* or *Kenya*? (15 marks)
(b) With reference to the country chosen in (a) above, assess the significance of the tourism industry. (10 marks)
8. To what extent had the physical factors contributed to famine in Sub-Saharan Africa? (25 marks)
